**SPECIAL TOWN BOARD MEETING FOR WATERFORD
APPROVED/OFFICIAL MINUTES FOR APRIL 25, 2013
5:30 PM AT THE TOWN HALL**

Special Town Board meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM by Chairman Hincz. Present: Supervisors Gauerke, Jeschke and Szeklinski.

- ✓ Purpose: to fill the vacancy in the office of Town Board Supervisor. The position, which became vacant on April 16, 2013, was previously held by Tom Hincz who was elected as Waterford Town Chairman on April 2, 2013.
- ✓ Chairman Hincz gave a brief synopsis of the state statute requirements as to what needs to be done to fill the vacancy. Hincz further indicated that the board members as well as the clerk have voting authority.
- ✓ Chairman Hincz indicated that the town could have held a special election however that would not be practical as that may have taken weeks and the town needs to fill the vacant seat. All the candidates who submitted letters of interest were all qualified and Chairman Hincz invited those who will still interested should run for election next year. The five candidates are as follows (in the order of the date the letter of interest was received):
 1. Nick Draskovich
 2. Dave Wagner
 3. Max Wenck
 4. Jan Alvey
 5. Teri Nicolai

There are no interviews as the board has had time to review all the letters of interest and letters of recommendations from residents. Whoever is appointed will be sworn in tonight.

- ✓ Supervisor Szeklinski motioned to nominate Nick Draskovich to the board, seconded by Supervisor Gauerke. Chairman Hincz entertained questions of the board members to Mr. Draskovich. Supervisor Gauerke noted that Nick has been on the Planning Board for 5 years and has done an excellent job. Supervisor Gauerke asked Mr. Draskovich if there was anything further he wanted to say that was not part of his letter. Mr. Draskovich indicated that his letter sums up his intentions for being a Town

Supervisor and feels he can help the board out. He further noted that he plans to stay in the town for many years as this is where he grew up. Supervisor Szeklinski questioned Mr. Draskovich if he would resign from his current seat on the Planning Commission, Mr. Draskovich indicated he would. He indicated that he would still plan on attending Planning Commission meetings to keep up with their recommendations to the Town Board and would like to see that position filled by someone else that the board can appoint. Supervisor Jeschke indicated that she had questions pertaining to recent events that have been a priority for the Town of Waterford board to make decisions over. Supervisor Jeschke questioned Mr. Draskovich how he felt about the town police dept. and the sheriff's dept. She asked if he supported a local police dept. or did he support the sheriff's dept. coming in and what was Mr. Draskovich's view on this issue from what he knew of it. Mr. Draskovich indicated that he did not know much about the issue. Mr. Draskovich indicated that he had been coming to Town Board meetings and hears the reports that the Chief has to offer. He further noted that he has been primarily involved with the Planning Commission side; his interest is in the police dept. that the Town currently has be successful and remain. That said Mr. Draskovich noted he had a lot to learn about each dept. within the Town and is willing to learn. Chairman Hincz called for all in favor for Nick Draskovich. All voted including clerk in favor of said motion with Supervisor Jeschke abstaining. No opposition was voiced. All in favor. Motion carried.

- ✓ Chairman Hincz thanked the other candidates. Attorney Dubis submitted the resolution to be signed. Supervisor Jeschke was told she did not have to sign as there was already a majority.
- ✓ Supervisor Gauerke motioned to adjourn at 5:41 pm, seconded by Supervisor Gauerke. All in favor. Motion carried.
